This 40-hour (min.) course will provide participants with a solid foundation for serving as part of a community of well-informed citizen volunteers with the goal of advancing education, research, and outreach efforts dedicated to the conservation and management of Kentucky's natural resources areas. Upon successful completion of this course, participants will become a certified Kentucky Master Naturalist (KYMN). During the course, participants will volunteer a minimum of 40 hours with a local organization focused on natural resource conservation and management and will complete a capstone project.

The cost of the extension training is \$250. UK (for-credit) is tuition bearing.

Topics Covered: Water resources, wildlife, soils, invasive species, aquatic macroinvertebrates, botany, safety & health, geology, ecology, weather & climate, environmental education, citizen science
